# Introduction

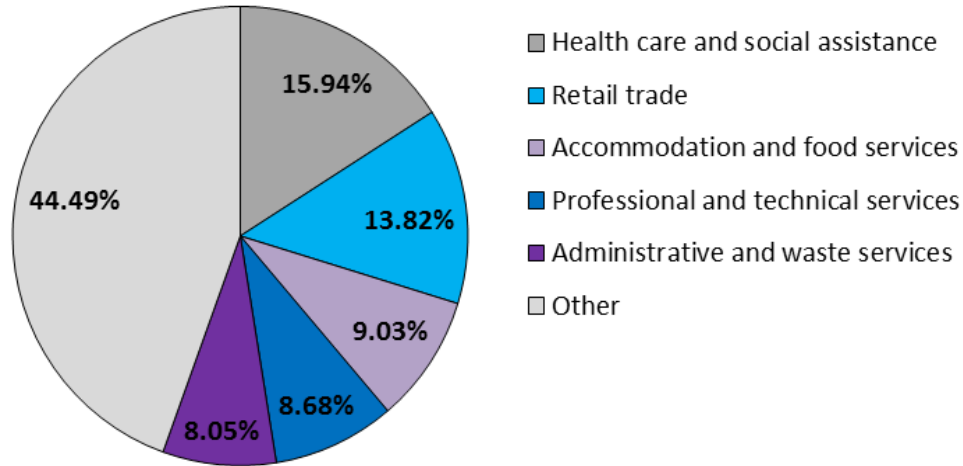
- Industry clusters are employment concentration of a particular industry within a geographic region

# Purpose

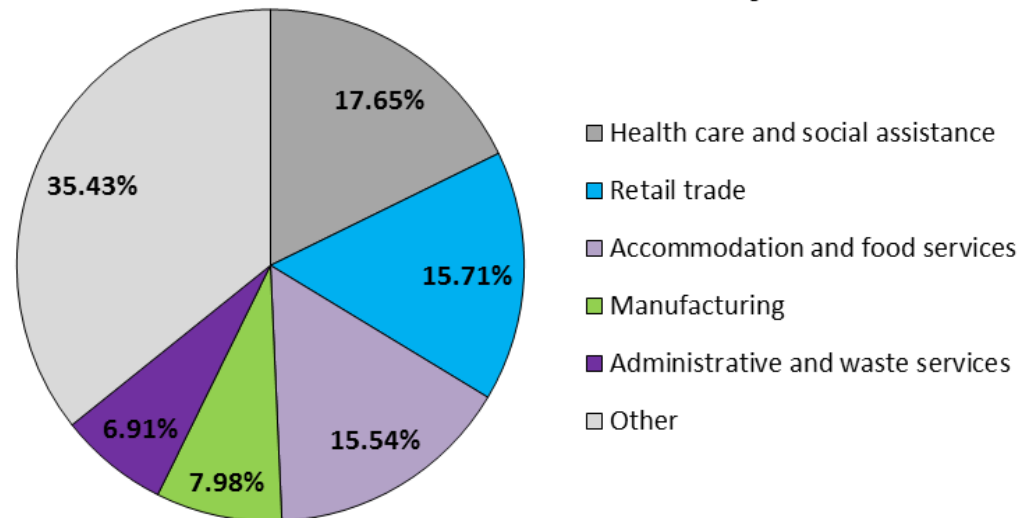
- Identify and measure the 2012 industry clusters in each county

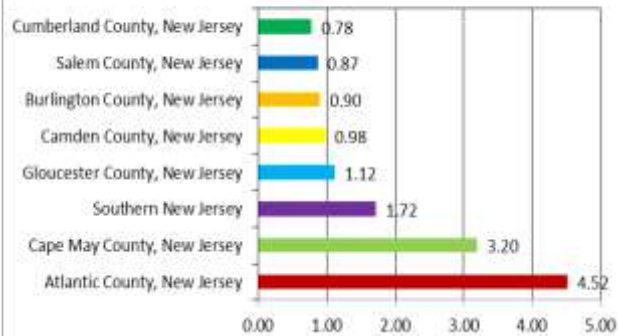
# Industry Location Quotient

- A calculated ratio between the local economy and the economy of reference unit
- Quantifying how “concentrated” an industry is in a region compared to a larger geographic area

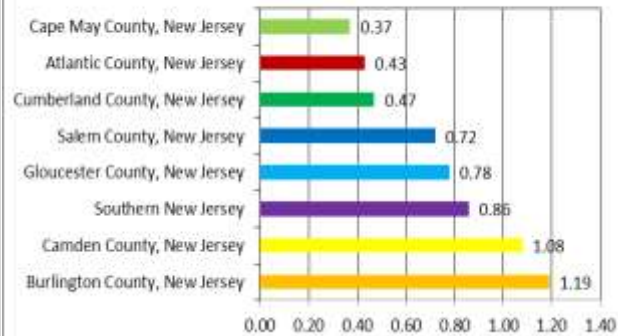
Understanding Location Quotients	
LQ is greater than 1.0	Local industry has competitive advantage
LQ is equal to 1.0	Local industry has same share as reference area
LQ is less than 1.0	Local industry needs development
