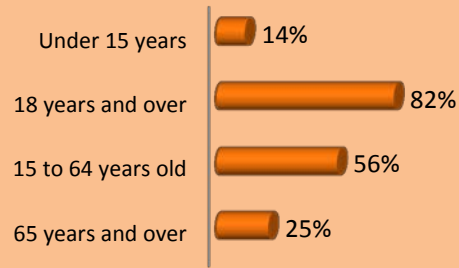

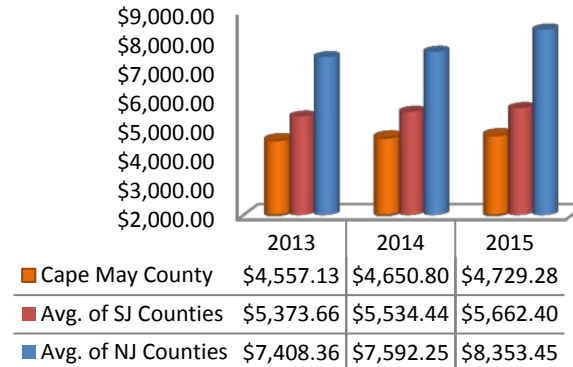
### Housing Occupancy



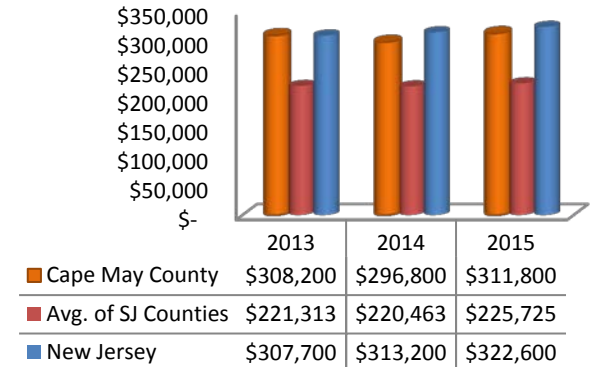

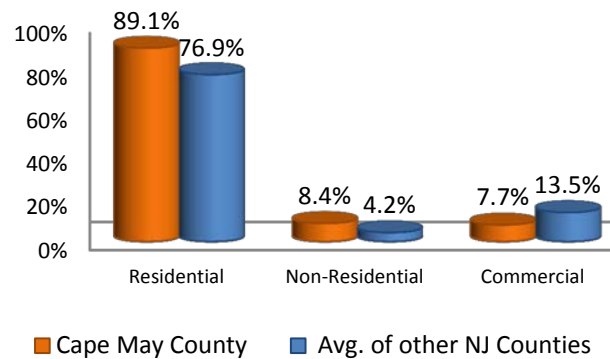

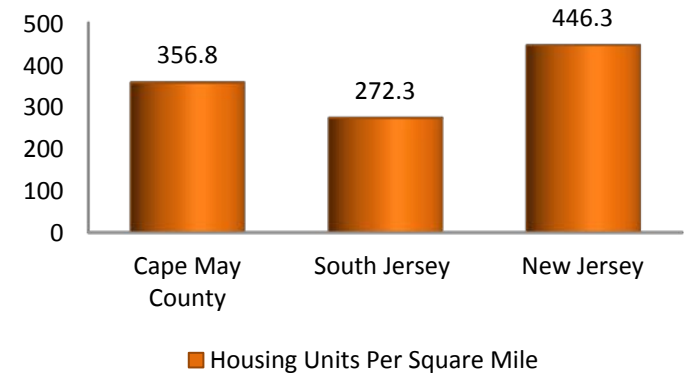
### Median Housing Value



### Land Use (Parcel Values as a % of Total Value)

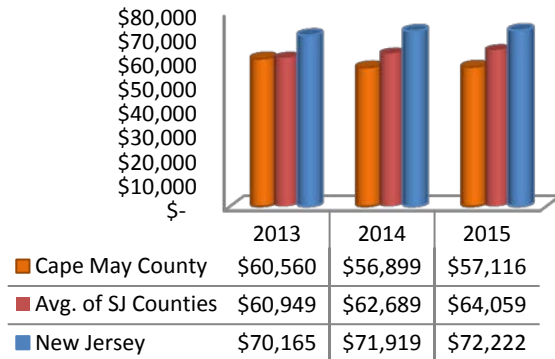

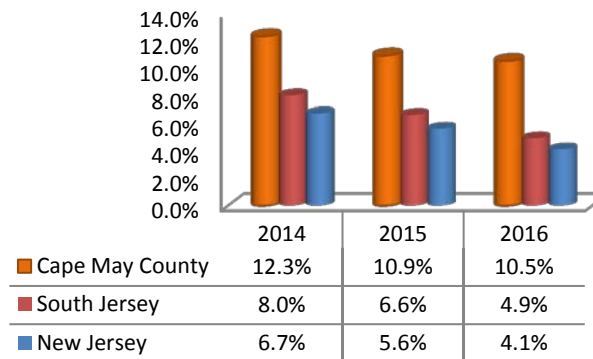

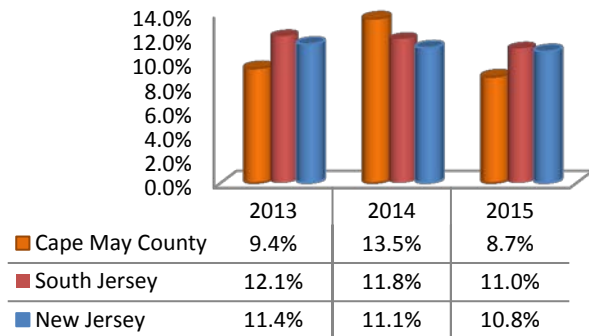

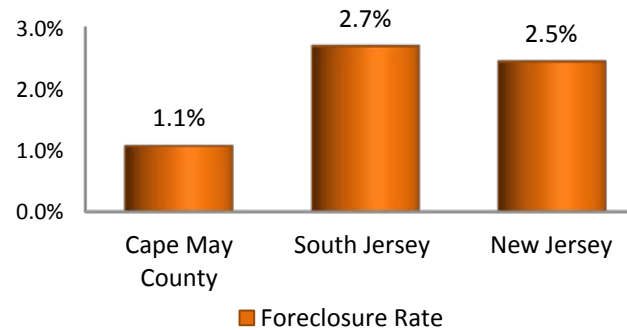

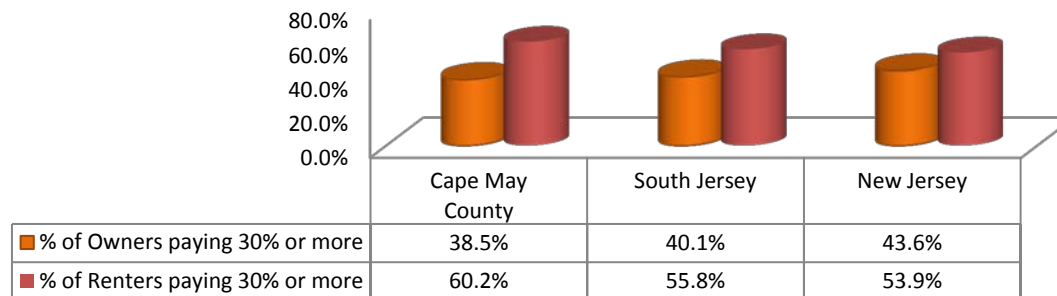

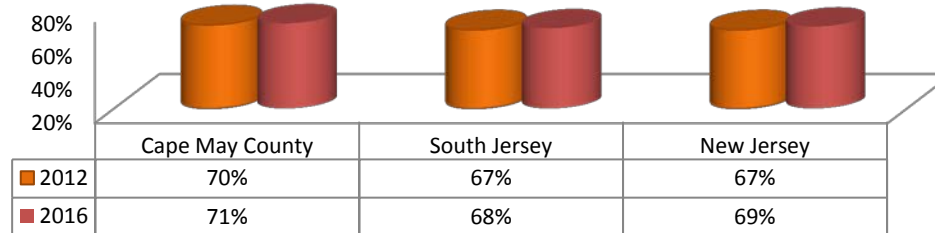

## Health Outcomes Rankings



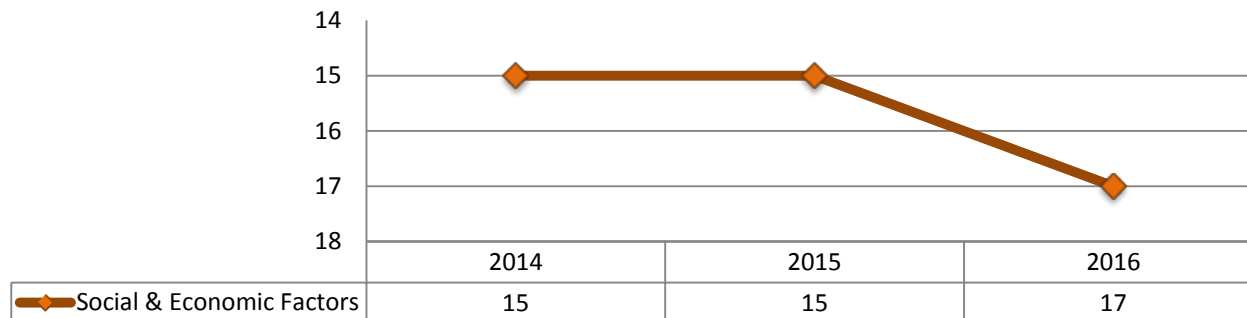
Health Outcome rankings are based on variables used to determine length and quality of life.

## Health Factors Rankings



Health Factor rankings are based on variables used to determine the following: health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors, and physical environment.

## Social & Economic Factors Rankings



Social and Economic Factor rankings are based on the following variables: high school graduation, some college, unemployment, children in poverty, income inequality, children in single parent households, social association, violent crime, and injury deaths.

## Other Rankings Influencing Health Outcomes (out of 21)

- Length of Life: 18<sup>th</sup>
- Quality of Life: 6<sup>th</sup>

## Other Variables Influencing Health Outcomes

- Premature Deaths: 7,000 per 100,000 population
- 7% of live births with low birth weights

## Other Rankings Influencing Health Factors (out of 21)

- Health Behavior: 18<sup>th</sup>
- Clinical Care: 6<sup>th</sup>
- Physical Environment: 4<sup>th</sup>

## Other Variables Influencing Health Factors

- Adult Smoking: 17%
- Adult Obesity: 27%
- Excessive Drinking: 18%
